IB DIPLOMA PROGRAMME

- An international study programme maintained by the International Baccalaureate Organisation (<u>www.ibo.org</u>).
- IB is not "high school studies" in English.
- You only study six subjects that you choose from six subject groups, which means going deeper into the subject
- In addition, every student does the Core Studies: Theory of Knowledge, CAS (Creativity, Activity, Service-> good fun!) and the Extended Essay.
- The whole package resembles studying at University: more responsibility on students.
- IB is very well-known internationally.





- Three subjects must be studied in higher level (HL) and a student can also pick a fourth HL-subject. Another three subjects are studied in standard level (SL).
- Gaudia has top quality information technology equipment in all the classrooms and modern learning facilities.



SUBJECTS AVAILABLE AT GAUDIA IB-SCHOOL

Basically, one subject from each group. Two languages + Mathematics are compulsory choices, otherwise the student decides!:

Group 1: Language A: Finnish A, English A (lang. & lit.)

Group 2: Language B: English B, Spanish ab initio, SL only

Group 3: History, Economics, ESS
(Environmental Systems
& Societies, SL only)

Group 4: Biology, Chemistry Physics

Group 5: Mathematics

Group 6: Visual arts OR another choice from groups 3-5





ABOUT THE STUDIES IN A FINNISH IB SCHOOL...


- The first year is called the Pre-Year when you study normal "high school" subjects BUT the teaching is in English! (except for the Finnish language).
- Over the following two academic years, IB1 & IB2, you study the chosen IB-subjects + the Core studies.



THE CORE OF THE DIPLOMA PROGRAMME

This is what each IB-student does:

- Theory of Knowledge (TOK)
 "How do we know what we we claim to know?"
- CAS: Creativity, Activity, Service
 You can for example learn to play
 an instrument. It's all about personal growth
- **Extended Essay:** a lengthy academic essay on the 2nd IB-year







- IB-final written exams take place in May of the last IB-year (IB2).
- Other languages, such as German or French, can be studied on the national side of Kannas.
- IB-students join all the 'lukio' festivities, too!
- In the IB the students stick together all through the three years, which enhances the sense of community.



HOW TO APPLY?

- There is no entrance examination for Finnish applicants.
- Registration for application is done on www.opintopolku.fi -> your OPO will guide you there!
- The Grade Point Average from Languages, Humanities, Mathematics and Sciences (lukuaineet) will be taken into account.
- The grade from the Finnish and English languages as well as Mathematics will be multiplied by two.
